We will be blocks away from flashing lights and glitzy performers, but the Tastos have arranged for some very special surprise entertainment during the reception hour

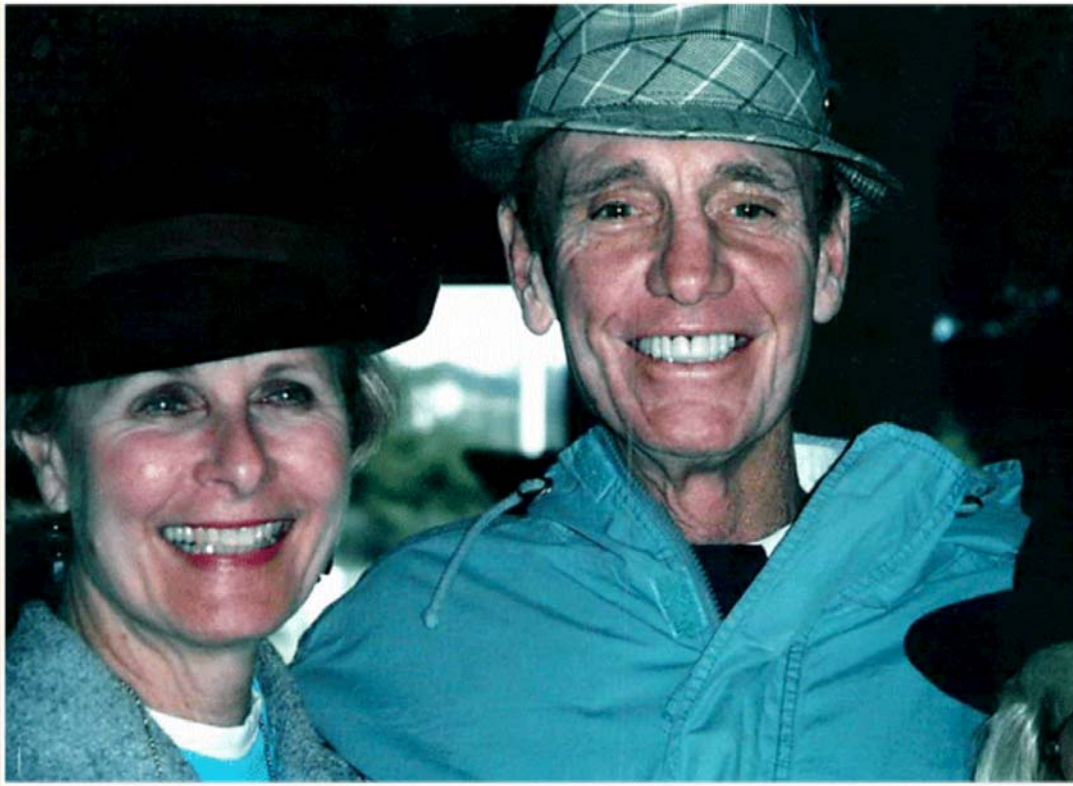
before dinner. And, although we will be welcoming our new members that night, they will not be the surprise entertainers. We will all have to wait for their performance this summer in Sedona.

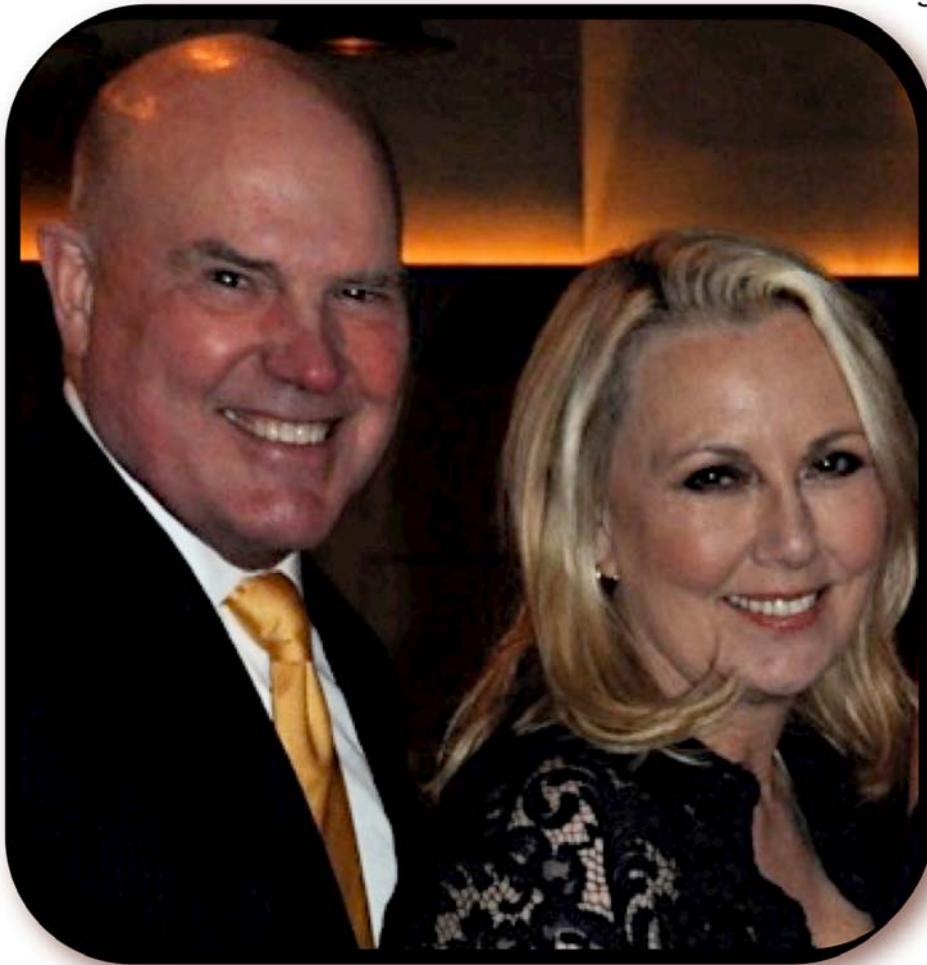
